



#### **AAOHN Foundation 2020 Financial Report**

## Foundation Growth Contribution



The Foundation saw a decrease in giving during 2021. We experienced a 54.64% decrease in contributions from 2020. Overall, the Foundation collected \$43,151 in contributions for 2021 due inability to host fundraising events through the virtual conference.

In 2021, 55% of all Foundation expenses were considered charitable, meaning those expenses paid to AAOHN members as scholarships and grants. The other 45% were considered non-charitable expenses such as consulting, storage fees, bank fees, tax filings, postage and funds not recovered from conference event fees.

**Ratio Analysis** 


Percent Spent on Charitable Purpose is 60%

The AAOHN Foundation received \$43,151 in gifts, grants and contributions from donors in 2021. Due to pivoting to a virtual 2021 National Conference. The Foundation experienced the inability to hold fund-raising events. The Foundation ended 2021 with \$43,151 in revenue, \$34,472 in expenses for a net gain of \$8,679. In 2021, the Foundation had a spending ratio of 55%, meaning that 55% of all expenses were awards for educational scholarships and scientific research. 45% of funds were spent on administrative expense. 0% of the Foundation's total funds were spent on contributions expenses.
